PART 2: THE LOVING TREE


- · SLS students created a paper tree to hang in the school.

SLS has helped enhance my skills by helping me stand up for what is right, find my voice, and reason in the world. SLS is different from other groups because it focuses on working together and realizing what really goes on in our community." -Savannah, SLS President Circle Montana.

SLS has many chapters across the state of Michigan. In August 2018, SLS successfully trained a new group of students from Circle High School and Middle School in Circle, Montana about the core messages of SLS: leadership, resistance skills, anti-bullying, being aware of ourselves and the world around us. Students participated in outside team building activities and they demonstrated skills and information they learned about anti-bullying and safe driving through skits and role plays. They also created a massive banner for their group that they can display at homecoming, school and community events. Students were trained in The Leadership Institute, which includes: Personal Leadership Skills, Team Building Skills, Leadership in the Community, and Starting the SLS Chapter. In addition SLS trained the Superintendent, Sheriff, Pastor, Public Health Nurse, Coalition members, School Counselor, local Newspaper Publisher, School teachers, and other interested adults/parents in youth development, prevention, youth-led chapter formation, exchanging assets with the community, and advising a youth-led organization.

The students presented chapter action plans and project ideas to the Circle Superintendent who is very supportive. Students created traditions for their chapter, such as: fun name tags each day based on the theme (t-shirt size, favorite car, and nickname). The first chapter project students put "Circle SLS" stickers on water bottles that SLS students handed out for free at the Health Department for two days while all students got their physicals. This was a great advertising and recruitment strategy. The trainings were fun, interactive, easy going and created opportunities for youth to lead.


